REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
February 23rd, 2026

CALL TO ORDER: The City Council of Lisbon, Iowa, met in regular session on February 23rd, 2026, at 7:00p.m. with Mayor Doug O'Connor presiding. The following City Council members were present: John Bardsley, Nathan Smith and Kevin Steele. Rawley Alger and Rick Scott were absent.

CONSENT AGENDA: Motion by Bardsley, seconded by Smith to approve the consent agenda consisting of minutes of February 9th and list of bills. Motion carried 3-0.

Motion by Smith, seconded by Bardsley to approve Downtown Reinvestment rebate to Indulgence Salon for \$4,853.46. All Ayes. Motion carried 3-0.

Motion by Bardsley, seconded by Steele to approve Downtown Reinvestment Grant Application for Bill's Tap. All Ayes. Motion carried 3-0.

Ambulance Director Jacob Lindauer presented the council with the LMVAS Annual Report.

Motion by Bardsley, seconded by Smith to move City Legal Services from Lederer Weston Craig to Lynch Dallas. All Ayes. Motion carried 3-0.

Motion by Smtih, seconded by Bardsley to approve Resolution 07-2026 Employee Certification wage increase for Jacob Siggins. Effective February 11th, 2026, Siggins will receive a \$.50 hour increase for obtaining his Water Distribution Certification making his new hourly wage \$28.075. Roll call vote. Motion by Smith, seconded by Steele to approve Resolution 08-2026 Fire Department members. Roll call vote. Ayes: Bardsley, Steele and Smith. Absent: Alger and Scott. Nays: None. Motion carried 3-0.

Motion by Smith, seconded by Bardsley to set a Public Hearing for Budget Statement for March 23rd, 2026, at 6:45pm. All Ayes. Motion carried 3-0.

Motion by Smith, seconded by Steele to set a Public Hearing for the Engineers Report on the Preliminary Plat for the City of Lisbon EMS District for March 23rd, 2026, at 7pm. All Ayes. Motion carried 3-0.

The council received the following reports from city departments:

Public Works Director Travis Bagby – Alliant sidewalk filled with a plan for fixing, cold patch done, will return when weather allows, all radio reads in now with only eight manuals left. Completing meter audits with clerks, building a tool rack for repurposed truck, dump truck fixed, library list of repairs completed minus new fireplace.

Parks & Recreation Director Drayton Kamberling – boys' basketball is done, spring soccer registration is open with a deadline of March 6th, field clean up will be March 7th from 9-11am pending weather, Easter Event April 4th.

Police Chief Jason Blinks – report submitted, Officer Macke in academy doing well, busy week last week. Ambulance Director Jacob Lindauer – preparing for March 25th inspection, information meetings for EMS District plans.

City Administrator Brandon Siggins – new fire applicants training, grass fires, St. Patty's Day dance March 14th from 8-Midnight with funds going to new truck and air packs. Noon whistle has been turned off awaiting parts. Working on budget, nuisances, insurance claim, and dog license ordinance discussion. Funds still available for Downtown Reinvestment grant and BE Lisbon grant.

Council and Mayor thanked the new fire members for their commitment, the city crews for clearing the recent snow and the fire department for the numerous fire calls handled last week.
