REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
March 25th, 2024

CALL TO ORDER: The City Council of Lisbon, Iowa, met in regular session on March 25th, 2024, at 7:00p.m. with Mayor Doug O'Connor presiding. The following City Council members were present: John Bardsley, Mike Williams, and Keven Steele. Rick Scott and Nathan Smith were absent.

City Engineer Hunter Schulte – Water main project wrapping up, Business 30 cost estimates coming soon.

Public Works Director Travis Bagby – filling in settled spots, fence up around one barn, leaf pickup tomorrow weather pending, snow fence is on order for the other barns.

Parks & Recreation Director Drayton Kamberling – soccer started Thursday weather pending, Easter egg hunt Saturday at 11:30am, spring clean up at the park will be Saturday April 6th at 9am.

City Administrator Brandon Siggins – grass truck will be here the middle of May; dance fundraiser last weekend was very successful. Meeting with Historic Preservation, OPN architect coming, joint school board meeting this week, contractor for lower windows will return when temperatures are in the sixties, supplies for the water and sewer connections at the complex have been ordered. Winstream bore on Washington Street and many repairs are needed for grass damage. Attending a conference in Des Moines April 3rd and 4th.

Council thanked public works for their recent efforts for the surprise snow day and thanked Ann Opatz for all her time and efforts while serving on the Historic Preservation Board. Friends of the Library will not be holding their annual trivia night this year.
