SPECIAL CITY OF LISBON/LISBON COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING MINUTES
April 27th, 2026

CALL TO ORDER: The City Council of Lisbon, Iowa, met in special session on April 27th, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Doug O'Connor presiding. The following City Council members were present: John Bardsley, Rawley Alger, Rick Scott, and Kevin Steele. Absent was Nathan Smith.

OTHERS PRESENT: Lisbon Community School Board Members and staff: Jen Caspers, John Baker, John Prasil, Robyn Richey, Autumn Pino, Travis Bagby, and Angie Santis. City Staff present included: Drayton Kamberling, Brandon Siggins and Christina Eicher.

Motion by Bardsley, seconded by Scott to approve the agenda. All Ayes. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Baker, seconded by Richey to approve the agenda. All Ayes. Motion carried 5-0.

City Administrator Brandon Siggins shared with the group happenings within the city including Well #5 nearing completion and sports complex diamonds work should be finished by end of summer. Washington St. patches along with other areas, meeting with a builder for the industrial park, 40 acres near complex area may be open to possible housing development. Explained the upcoming special election for the EMS district. Siggins thanked the school for their continued partnership working with the city.

School Superintendent Autumn Pino shared with the group happenings within the school district including an update on the legacy hallway and preparations for graduation events. Lisbon schools will be hosting three major track events with Tri Rivers Conference on May 7th, JH meet on May 8th and State Qualifier meet on May 14th. These events will bring a lot of people and traffic to town on these evenings. Pino thanked the city for hosting the joint meeting and for the long-standing relationship between the school and city.

The group discussed the shared facilities agreement. A walk-through will take place prior to the start of the contract and again before the wrap-up date. Any items needing attention will be addressed then. Batting cages are becoming a safety concern due to wear and tear, ballpark fence was discussed about leaving it up all year but would require a fall leaf cleanup to keep things looking nice. AEDS mounted outside concessions for full park access.

Next meeting has been tentatively set for March 10th, 2027, at 6pm and will be located at the school.

Mayor Doug O'Connor adjourned the meeting at 6:30pm.
