CITY OF LISBON
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
September 11th, 2023

CALL TO ORDER: The City Council of Lisbon, Iowa, met in regular session on September 11th, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Pro-Temp Nathan Smith presiding. The following City Council members were present: John Bardsley, Sara Nost, Mike Williams, and Nathan Smith. Mayor Doug O'Connor and council member Rick Scott were absent.

OTHERS PRESENT: Drayton Kamberling, Brandon Siggins, Doug Shannon, and Dave Schechinger.

CONSENT AGENDA: Motion by Nost, seconded by Smith to approve the consent agenda consisting of minutes of August 28th, list of bills, utility refunds and August treasurer's report. All Ayes. Motion carried 4-0.

City Engineer Dave Schechinger gave an update on city projects. The water main will continue down Jackson Street before resurfacing the intersection of Main and Washington in order to keep a main road open.

Motion by Nost, seconded by Bardsley to go into public hearing at 7:04pm for Budget Amendment #1 FY24. All Ayes. Motion carried 4-0.

City Administrator Brandon Siggins presented the items for the amendment. \$56,200 for the purchase of the new grass truck, \$5,925 for ambulance workers comp and group insurance, and \$11,000 for cemetery GIS project. Motion by Nost, seconded by Smith to go out of public hearing at 7:06pm. All Ayes. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Nost, seconded by Bardsley to approve Resolution 29-2023 Approving Budget Amendment #1 for FY24. Roll call vote. Ayes: Nost, Bardsley, Williams, Smith. Absent: Scott. Nays: None. Motion carried 4-0.

Historic Preservation has received a Linn County Grant for the barns at the sports complex.

The council received the following reports from city departments:

City Engineer Dave Schechinger – well recommendations are in the works, hopefully by the next meeting.

Parks & Recreation Director Drayton Kamberling – first games of fall sports start this week, girls' basketball registration is now open, have started talking Halloweentown plans.

Police Chief Doug Shannon – August report submitted, roundabout delays/construction starting in Mount Vernon.

City Administrator Brandon Siggins – pancake breakfast had an estimated 1,400 people, with a profit around \$14,000. Event was well attended by citizens and members of the department. Working on specs for slide in unit. Crews are working on seeding, water, and stump grinding, Brecke will be starting hydro seeding, YTT plans are done, pavilion at the complex still in the works, Alliant project is wrapping up, low hanging branches to be addressed along with low hanging wires from Windstream, and the BE Lisbon grant has been posted.

Council congratulated the fire department on a successful breakfast and Historic Preservation on the grant. They thanked citizens for their patience during all the projects in town. Red Cedar will be playing on September 30th at 11am in Heritage Hall.
